We have reached week five of the term and are rapidly approaching the end of a very interesting year. There are some very important jobs that need to be completed in the next few weeks and staff are working hard to ensure we finish the year strong and are also in a good place to hit the ground running next year.

NCEA exams are now underway, and students are reporting that they are hard but feel confident that they have done well fingers are crossed that this continues. We hope there are many happy smiles when results are released in January (usually around the 14th, but this has been flexible recently).

We have a paid union meeting for teachers happening on the 28th November so the school will be closed early on this date. We are able to offer the first three lessons of the day and will close at 12.20pm. ## Making Time to Read

**Reading is good for our brain – and can be enjoyable.**

As the summer break approaches, we have a good opportunity to consider the importance of reading in our lives. Plenty of our tamariki will have more time to spend on this activity over the summer, so why should they?

On a general level – ‘read to survive’ comes to mind. We all know how often we encounter reading in our lives and know that we need to be able to do it.

Studies also continue to reinforce the importance of reading: those teenagers who choose to read are far more likely to be successful in ALL their learning. Scientific studies also reinforce the importance of reading for our brains: it helps us with decision-making, reflection, building our minds, aging, finding our place in the world, growing empathy, exploring the imagination, and growing our vocabulary.

A glance at that list tells us that it is also good for our well-being, regardless of age.

**So, what can you do as a parent or caregiver and as one who cares about your child’s education and development?**

Firstly, get your child to take part in the summer reading programme at school or use the local library. The programme at Tokomairiro High School even offers free books and treats. Of course, checking out the books from the library is one thing; the next step is to make sure the reading happens. Generally, most of us like a comfortable place to read: whether on our bed, in our favourite chair, or in the shade outside. It does not have to be a lone activity either; you can all sit companionably reading your own books, or you can read together, or listen and read. There are plenty of audiobooks available from the library and online at no cost. This can help with those less confident in their reading. There is also research that stresses how good it is for relationships to share reading.

A huge pay-off of regular reading for up to 30 mins a day is improvement in concentration. Clearly, this is beneficial for learning and well-being. It can be hard to do this if you are not used to it, but it is okay to build up to it gradually.

Really – this activity to engage the brain is a ‘no-brainer’ when you think about it. All those benefits, no drawbacks – and it is free as well. Once children and teenagers discover the joy of reading, they have a gift for life.

Best overall house was..... Reid!!

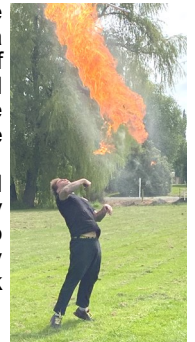
It is planned to run these types of events every term here at Tokomairiro High School in 2023!

## Community Welcome at Cemetery Project Conclusion

Six years after they were excavated from Milton's St John's cemetery, the remains of 27 people who have helped shed light on the lives of early European settlers will again be laid to rest.

The Southern Cemeteries Archaeological Project will conclude its work at Milton's St Johns Cemetery with a public service on 26 November officiated by Rev Vivienne Galletly. Project co-lead Professor Hallie Buckley, of the University of Otago's Department of Anatomy, says the community has an emotional and physical connection to the burial ground and welcomes them to take part.

"The community has ownership of the project, and many are descendants of people buried there. They were interested in doing something with the cemetery and we are very pleased to have been able to help them achieve that and identify some of those buried there."

"We are also grateful to have had the opportunity to investigate the lives, health, and burial traditions of early European settlers in New Zealand," she says.

The project began in 2014, and in November and December 2016, 29 unmarked graves were exposed, 16 of which were outside the fenced cemetery. Of those, 25 were excavated with the remains of 27 people found, ranging in age from infancy to adulthood, most of whom died in the 1870s.

Last used in 1926, the cemetery was officially closed in 1971, and it was not known if the existing fence was in the correct place.

Dr Petchey says the team is honoured to be able to tell the stories of people who have been lost.

"The project has enabled us to put them and their lives back into the landscapes they inhabited," he says, "and the foundations were laid for their grandchildren and great-grandchildren to lead better lives."

A monograph has been published, to be launched after the burial service. Dr Petchey says it contains archaeological information about the site and findings, as well as synopses of some people's lives.

The service will be held at St Johns Cemetery, Back Rd, Milton, 1pm Saturday, 26 November 2022. Service to be followed by a wake, brief sharing of project results and launch of a monograph on the project, from approximately 3pm at the Coronation Hall, Milton.

### Lynx

**Movement**  
Lynx move swiftly through the deep snow with their large muscular feet that act like snowshoes. The top speed of a lynx is 50km/h.

**Reproduction**  
Lynx mate between February and March, after two months of mating the female lynx will normally give birth to 2-4 kittens but can have up to six, they can only get pregnant once a year.

**Sensitivity**  
The lynx is becoming very rare in the northern United States due to hunting, habitat destruction and competition with the more aggressive bobcat.

**Growth**  
Lynx only weigh up to 20kg when they are first born and 8-12kg when they are fully grown. It takes 10 months for a female to fully grow and 12 months for a male to fully grow.

**Respiration**  
They breathe like any other mammal through their lungs.

**Excretion**  
Lynx are like house cats they often poop in the same place every time and cover it up with dirt or snow.

**Nutrition**  
Lynx feed on one deer, red deer, hinds, rabbits, hares, rodents and birds.

Students in Mrs Mickey's Year 7 and 8 science class have produced these colourful and informative posters after learning about the necessary features of living organisms. These spell out the acronym MRS GREN which stands for Movement, Reproduction, Sensitivity, Growth, Respiration and Excretion and Nutrition.

**SCORPION**

**MOVEMENT**  
Scorpions use their dorsal fin (back) to propel slowly forward. They are the slowest moving of all fish species. Moves 5 km/h and a half resting per hour.

**REPRODUCTION**  
The female transfers her eggs to make abdominal stings. The male releases sperm to fertilise the eggs as they swim. Before incubating them for 24 days until they are born. A female places up to 2,000 eggs inside a pouch on a male abdomen.

**SENSITIVITY**  
Scorpions are marine animals living in saltwater but can tolerate a range of salinity (Salt water) including the brackish waters of estuaries. Shows fresh and salt water smelt. Scorpions can't live in freshwater as their osmolarity increased normally with global warming and some transpire the osmolarity without eggs of larvae combined with a reduction of feeding and ventilation rates. Hypoxia is the increase in partial pressure of carbon dioxide.

**RESPIRATION**  
A scorpion ranges in size from as small as a pine needle to as large as a banana. It takes 4 to 6 months for a scorpion to grow to the size of an adult. Only about 0.5 percent will survive to adulthood. A scorpion can live for about 3 to 5 years.

**EXCRETION**  
Scorpions breathe through their gills on the back of their head.

**GROWTH**  
The bodies of the scorpions thicken out the waste from their blood and directs it to their urine bladder. When a scorpion has not eaten for a couple of days, their waste usually is white.

**NUTRITION**  
Scorpions suck in their food and swallow it whole. They feed on some extremely small fish, amphipods or plankton. Scorpions have a big appetite. Also a scorpion can go without food for one week.

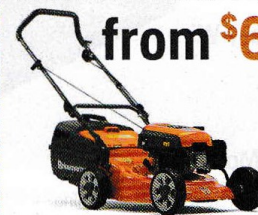
