Tokomairiro High School Students Participate in Kids Voting 2020

Monday and Tuesday of last week saw students given the opportunity to vote in a parallel election to that of their parents and caregivers.

The Party vote went the way of Labour (15) with the rest being National (9), Act NZ (3), NZ First (1), Green Party (1) and Aotearoa Legalise Cannabis Party (1) Ingrid Leary gained the electorate seat from Liam Kernaghan 14 votes to 10 votes. Scott

Willis and Oliver Lequeux gained one vote each and Mark Patterson, two.

Both referendums were passed with 8 Yes votes and no votes against the bills for both.

From the numbers; it was disappointing that so few voted but, as it is for us as eligible voters, it is a choice decision.

November 8, 2020 is the 15th running of the Coastal Classic MTB/Run/Walk event in Taieri Mouth.
