Pataka Kai Sharing Pantry for Milton!

Tokomairiro Waiora, the Lions Club of Milton and Project Bruce have come together to fund the construction of a beautiful Pataka Kai (sharing pantry) for our community to drop-off and pick-up supplies.

Following the success of the pantry that was installed last year at Knarsten Park in Taieri Mouth, the team at the Milton Community Shed pulled out their measuring tapes once again, to build another one.

Pataka Kai are popping up all over the country and are a beautiful way for people to give and receive food items. The pantry is located in the car park between Tokomairiro Waiora and the Tokmairiro Community Hub, opposite Supervalue in Milton, and is a place for the community to share food items and surplus garden produce. It will also house Hub Free-Market groceries outside of opening hours to increase the accessibility of goodies for our people. The kaupapa is simple: take what you need, leave what you can.

As we are now in the last few days of the school holidays, I am looking forward to welcoming our students and staff back next week for the start of the second term. I would like however, to take the opportunity to remind caregivers about a couple of things for next term.

Firstly we are heading very quickly toward winter and therefore it is a timely reminder that hoodies are not part of the school uniform, there are a number of uniform items available through NZ Uniforms that are suitable for the colder days we experience in Otago. Students can also wear thermals underneath their school shirts to keep themselves warm.

Secondly as of Monday the government's cell phone ban will be implemented across the school. This means that students will not be allowed to access their cell phones from the moment the first bell rings in the morning until after the last bell rings at the end of the school day. This includes lunchtime and interval. Caregivers have been sent the policy and students have had the new rules explained to them. I know that some students are unhappy with the ban but evidence from other countries and schools who have already implemented this ban has shown the effects are very positive for students' achievement and wellbeing.

As part of our preparation for this ban, last term students were given the opportunity to compete in a meme competition. It was great to see such a large number of entries and the winners were announced in assembly at the end of last term. Air quality can vary immensely throughout Otago, depending on

location and time of year. We accept we're able to enjoy good air quality most of the time. However, it's vital we improve air quality, where possible, to enable us to live in a healthier region.

Otago Regional Council is currently running its annual Burn Dry Breathe Easy campaign highlighting ways to ensure your firewood is dry for burning in winter, and the effects that burning wet wood and other items can have on the environment.

The Council hopes this campaign will encourage residents to consider the health of those in their area when using wood burners. Woodsmoke pollution can be reduced when residents burn only dry wood and keep their fire hot and not smouldering.

Air quality often degrades during winter due to increased domestic heating emissions, cold calm weather, and the occurrence of inversion layers. For this reason, ORC has monitoring sites in seven Otago towns: Milton, Mosgiel, Dunedin, Alexandra, Clyde, Cromwell and Arrowtown. These measure tiny particles in the air, including those from vehicle and industry emissions; however, the main source in Otago is home heating emissions. Studies using temporary sensors in other towns have also been conducted to investigate where full time monitoring could be beneficial.


