Kia ora,

The end of the term approaches and we have kicked into the final programme for our junior students. They have been undergoing lots of testing last week to determine our baseline in maths along with their reading and writing skills. We are using a Ministry programme called e-asTTle which stands for Assessment Tools for Teaching and Learning. This is a national test and unfortunately, we hit a busy time when conducting some of our maths tests. Demand across the country meant that the system overloaded and shut down. Consequently, students and staff had to revert to good old-fashioned pencil and paper creating extra work for both staff and students as their work was lost online. So, a big impressive thank you to those affected, you displayed great resilience and coped with this very well. An example of our staff and students living up to our school values of respect responsibility and excellence, well done.

We now move into more enjoyable aspect toward the end of the term as students have select passion projects and get the opportunity to enjoy some new activities that they may never have tried before or old favourites they want to do again. We also have several students heading to Dunedin to try some new sports. Swimming is a regular item on the curriculum and students are learning valuable survival skills during these activities. We also have a leadership camp happening for our senior students in order to prepare them for their roles as sen-

ior student leaders in the school.

There is still more happening, we welcome our prospective year 7 students on Monday 21st as they experience an orientation day. This involves them visiting our school and experience what it is like to be a high school student. The biggest change they will notice is having regular changes of subject along with different teachers and possibly being in a different room. A lot to take in during their short visit.

We are also preparing for our combined prize giving assembly at the end of the year. Teachers are collating results from a years work to decide who the top student in each subject or class will be so prizes can be awarded. The Transition to High School

During their years of schooling students make a number of transitions within and between schools. The transition from early childhood to primary school involves noticeable changes in curriculum content as well as a shift towards more structured learning practices. The transition from primary school to secondary school involves further changes in curriculum and the structure of learning.

This transition from primary school to secondary school is made more complex because students undergo significant cognitive, social and emotional changes at this stage of their development. It is a time of significant growth and change for young people: their personalities and characters develop along with more formal operational thinking skills, which allows them to engage in social environments in new ways.

The strongest finding across multiple studies is the importance of parents' educational aspirations for their children. Parents' high academic aspirations are strongly associated with academic achievement for primary and secondary education.

You can help your child by:

- Being open and clear with students about the fact that their social relationships and friendship groups may change.
- Communicating to students about how to access the forms of support available at secondary school
- Encouraging students to take advantage of the new opportunities, friends, cultural activities and learning they will encounter
- Actively fostering their students' sense of resilience, their ability to cope with challenges, their independence and their interpersonal skills such as active listening and cooperation.





Don't forget our lounge bar is available for the whole community to use so please ring the club for details or check out the website if you or your group are interested in using this great facility.




