
Kia ora,

Welcome back to Term 2. This is a short term of 10 weeks, and we will be looking to cram as much learning and achievement in as we can. I would like to thank both staff and students for their amazing efforts coping with the trials and tribulations we experienced in Term 1. Hopefully the rest of the year will run much smoother. We were very fortunate that Covid did not get a stronghold within the school, and we were able to continue to operate fairly normally. That being said, restrictions have changed due to the orange setting and we will still be keeping in place some of the restrictions that operated at red. Masks are no longer compulsory but will be strongly encouraged for staff and students. Separate toilets for year groups are still signposted and expected to be observed. Sanitiser will still be available for students entering classes.

The curriculum at Tokomairiro High School is split into two distinct sections (semesters). The reason for this is that it gives students a greater choice in their studies and should increase their effort and engagement in lessons. Semester 1 will be finishing on Friday 17th June and students will start their new programme the following Monday 20th. We are aware that some students work at a quicker rate than others and may not have finished their work in Semester 1. Therefore, the final day of Semester 1 will be a catch-up day for those students who need a little extra time to get work finished. The timetable will be collapsed, and staff will be available to help students who need it. Student who are up to date will have time to prepare for their next semester with some work to be done at home. Students will be invited individually for these sessions and further details will follow.

Early last term staff students and parents were invited to comment on the proposal to 'ban' phones from the school. The results have been analysed and a more detailed report on this will be available next week.


