Life Membership and Retirement Cap off Teaching Career

Lynne Philip retired from the Tokomairi Early Learning Centre on Wednesday August 3rd after almost 31 years of service, and was awarded a life membership in recognition of her dedication and service by the Centre Governing Committee.

She has been an integral part of TELC ever since it opened in September 1991 and during her tenure, more than 2,000 children have come through the doors and benefitted from her teaching skills and vision to progress the organisation forward. She has been the driving force behind several major projects including two renovations to the internal environment and a playground upgrade at the Johnson Street centre, and the opening of a second centre at Spenser Street in 2011. Lynne and her husband Allan also own the property next door to the Johnson Street centre and they have been very generous in allowing access to the back of the property via their driveway whenever work was undertaken that required the use of large machinery. The staff and Committee are very appreciative of this as in addition to the projects listed above, it also allowed for the building of the large covered deck to go ahead, a new fence and the new sandpit that was recently built.

Lynne was farewelled last Wednesday with a special graduation ceremony, where her life membership certificate and badge were presented. This was attended by the TELC staff and children as well as Kelly Holden and Cassey Scoles, as representatives of the Governing Committee. Current and former staff also celebrated with Lynne at a meal out at the Kink in the Road last Friday night.

The staff and Committee would like to thank Lynne so much for her years of service. The place won't seem the same without her, but they wish her all the best for a well deserved retirement, where she will have the opportunity to spend more time with her grandchildren and pursue her interests.

SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.

Kia ora,
We have reached week two and our students are back in the groove and working hard as we move through the term to get ready for assessments and exams.

There is a condition that may fit some of us which is known as the post-pandemic fog. This often displays itself as an inability to plan and make decisions or deal with deadlines.

As a teacher with over 30 years in education, a phrase I have heard often is "We don't know, what we don't know". When dealing with new tasks we often don't have the skills or knowledge to complete them because we do not know what all those skills might be. For example: Show me a broken car engine and I will quickly be able to tell you what I don't know - which is (quite clearly) how to fix it. However, my new phone may be able to work more efficiently for me, but I don't know all the amazing things it can do. *I don't know what I don't know.* It's easy to assume that students can use a diary or weekly planner or have the skills to organise a large event when they may have no experience of this, or they have never been shown how to do it.

This has been evident with our ball committee recently. We have a group of very committed individuals who have agreed to take on the responsibility of this major event on behalf of their peers. However, they quickly found themselves overwhelmed possibly due to the post pandemic fog or just lack of experience. We are therefore putting a new plan in place to ensure we make more rapid progress that we have done and ensure the event takes place. This will be a

valuable learning experience for all concerned, including me.

OPEN EVENING

We have our open evening on Wednesday 10th, and we are looking forward to meeting our prospective parents and new Year 7 students at 5:45pm. We will meet in the hall and after a brief introduction there will be the opportunity to meet several staff, get a tour of the school and experience several activities that are part of our curriculum. Parents at these meetings always comment how things have changed since they were at school. A fair comment which underlies the massive amounts of work teachers do to stay current and relevant in their subject areas.

TRAIL BIKE RIDE

Just a reminder that the annual trail bike ride is approaching rapidly, and the PTA are hard at work supporting the process from a school perspective. This is a massive event for the school, and I am very much looking forward to it.

We had a lovely week of weather last week and I made the mistake of asking whether winter was over.

Thank you to those who reminded me that it was foolish to make assumptions.


