Milton Community Shed Members Save Little Old Shed



On Thursday last week, five members of the weekly Milton Shed group embarked to the old Glenore railway tunnel, 12 kms from Milton, to resurrect a piece of the historical Tokomairiro-Lawrence railway line - a repair workers' overnight accommodation shed. This shed is ten minutes walk from the end of the Glenore tunnel, perched by the side of where the old railway ran, now a small road.

By the time we reached it, so many years after the railway's heyday, it was in total disrepair. It had a small fireplace and not much else. We cleared the surrounds for drainage, removed several wheelbarrows of accumulated dirt from inside and removed tin from the walls. This Thursday we will replace the tin, and plan to replace the chimney for the fireplace.

The line, originally known as the Lawrence Branch, was one of the longest construction projects in New Zealand railway history, beginning in the 1870s and not finished until 1928. The railway tunnel itself, which boasts a few glow-worms, was constructed around 1875 and is 442 blissfully cool metres in length as it was what would best be described as a 'stonking hot' day last Thursday. To get to the hut we had the complete pleasure of walking through the tunnel - in fact it was so hot that mist was rolling out of the tunnel as we walked back after our work.



The Milton Shed group is a non profit group who meets every Thursday from 9am-12pm at the large shed beyond the macrocarpas behind the rugby club rooms. Continue past the community gardens and the meat museum. We would welcome anyone interested in constructing, resurrecting and using their skills.

Making a New Start - Tips for Transition

Last week we were very privileged to welcome Year 7's to our Tokomairiro family. Starting a new school is a BIG DEAL! There are so many things happening in the first few weeks at school that is both exciting and fun but also things that can make students feel scared and worried.

Some common concerns for new students involve not knowing anyone, wanting to make new friends, meeting new teachers and school staff, finding your way around, meeting new academic expectations, and generally feeling nervous and anxious about the unknown.

This is all completely normal. The good news as caregivers you have all the experience needed to help your child!

Every one of us has been through this same experience. It is important to be positive about this transition by talking about new opportunities for friendships and activities that await them. If you find it hard to talk about it can also be a good idea to call on an older teen who has been through it. We are privileged as a school to have a great group of Year 13's who are peer support leaders. All new Year 7's have been placed in groups each week to form relationships and do activities with these great role models and leaders. This is a perfect opportunity for them to explore their feelings in a safe manner.

In the mornings it can also be very helpful to make sure that their bag, uniform and essentials are sorted and easily accessible to ensure that a good routine is established. One of things caregivers often comment on are that their child "just isn't used to this and their old school was home."

Get your child to look to the future even if they're missing their old school a bunch. Avoid comparing the old to the new. Most importantly, have them recognise that not all stress is bad. The unknown can be really scary but things like breathing exercises, getting active, and having "me time" can all help with the transition.

In a couple of weeks things will settle and on reflection this change will be embraced and normalised with celebration that your child is now a teen!

Stage 3 water restrictions for Milton

Milton is on stage 3 water restrictions due to critically low reservoir levels, hot weather and increased demand.

It is important that people follow the restrictions and try to reduce water use to ensure water supply doesn't run out.

Work to identify and fix the cause of the low reservoir level is continuing.

Stage 3 restrictions mean:

- There is a hosing ban, with the exception that people can use a handheld hose for watering gardens one day a week, between 8pm to 8am only.
- Sprinkler & irrigation system use is banned.
- People are asked to avoid washing cars and boats etc.
- Commercial operators that require water can contact Council for approval.
