"Good Morning Sunshine"

The Milton Opportunities Charitable Trust (MOCT) has developed a new program for the community called *Good Morning Sunshine*. This is a program for the elderly, the lonely and for

people with health issues. It is non-invasive and is security conscious. The program involves three steps.

Registration

A person will register with us to join the program. As part of this registration they will also let us know the details of their local emergency contact. If they have no local emergency contact then we can become that as well by knowing who their doctor is, and by having a key to their home which will be kept in our safe on a secure key chain with a key register (very similar to how a security company manages the keys for alarm patrols)

Curtains Open

Each morning the registered person must have their front room curtains open by 9am. We will do a drive-by to ensure that they are open. If they are open we do nothing.

Curtains Closed

If the persons curtains are not open then we will knock on the door to ascertain that all is okay. If we get no response then we will immediately contact their emergency contact person. If we are the contact person, then we will enter the house and check that all is okay. If the situation warrants it, then we will contact the necessary emergency services.

The object of the program is to give peace of mind, so that the person knows that if they have a fall during the night, or a medical event, some-one will be there in the morning to make sure they are okay.

We hear more and more about people who have died in their homes and not been found for days, or people who have lain on the floor hurt for days before receiving assistance. Our program will ensure that this situation does not arise in our community with the people that are registered with us.

This is not a new concept, it has been around for years on a much smaller scale where neighbours look out for each other. We would be taking it to the next level.

Our staff that will be doing the checks each day will be trained in first aid and will have completed counselling regarding what they may find when they enter someone's home. We want to ensure that our people are fully prepared for any situation.


