### **Head Prefect Follow-Up**

**Shannon:** We've seen how the others before us have done it, and it's gone fast. Thought there would be more pressure on us.

Do people treat you differently from before?

Seth: Not really, it's pretty much the same.

**Shannon:** People still don't really know who I am so it hasn't changed

We are continuing to provide our usual health and social services - The Milton Foodbank referral service, Mirror HQ Services, Well South Brief Intervention Service, Plunket, Clutha Budget Advisory Service, Community Law Otago, Stop Smoking Coach, Stopping Violence, Adventure Development, Massage Therapy, K1W1 Counselling, ACC Counselling, Project Bruce, South Coast Psychology and a representative from the office of Ingrid Leary.

representative from the office of Ingrid Leary. Unfortunately, we have lost our Methodist Mission Community Specialist but the new Community Chaplains who are volunteering in the Hub on a Tuesday and Thursday morning are working well to fill this gap.

The free market is still running weekly with bread arriving most Tuesday afternoons and food provided from Project Bruce through KiwiHarvest on a Thursday morning. We are always looking for food or fresh produce donations for the sharing pantry as rising food costs are making life difficult for some families.

The Tokomairiro Community Hub would like to say a huge thank you to The Lions Club of Milton for their \$2500 donation! This will go a long way towards replacing the damage done and vouchers stolen in the Christmas burglary.

### Tokomairiro Training Mid Year Report

Nineteen students are currently enrolled at Tokomairiro Training. Some are working full time on NCEA levels one and two while others are participating in the Forestry Pathways course which is giving these students an insight into the forestry industry as a whole.

Practical skills, as part of some of the industry unit standards, are an attraction to this programme.

A general knowledge of health and safety which is also included in the unit standards delivered on site, and is also seen by the students as being useful knowledge if moving onto employment in any area within the primary industry sector.

good for the first half of 2022. This is an indication that the majority of students are enjoying their time on the course.

### **Milton Primary Arts Week**

Milton Primary experienced a lot of excitement last week as our inaugural Arts Week got underway. Ākonga had the opportunity to learn about a subject from the Arts curriculum for five afternoons in addition to their usual classroom programme. clay, Dance, sketching, and digital technology were among the options available to the students.

With clay, they initially practiced the skills of rolling, pinching and coiling the clay. They then used these skills to create their own photo frame which they decorated using a variety of techniques.

The digital art group spent the building Lego Robots, week designing a holder for a marker or paintbrush and then coding the robots to move! Thinking about how to create a code that in turn created an interesting artwork was very challenging! There were lots of things to think about, like how to keep the paper still, how to use different colours or textures and how to keep the robots clean at the same time!

Dance saw the children exploring the elements of dance and creating a dance together to share. They were lucky enough to have a guest dance teacher come to school to teach them new dance skills. They also explored different culture's traditional dances.

Sketching saw students exploring observational sketching techniques within artwork of still life. It was a fruity experience with the children sketching an apple. Their sketch was then copied, allowing them to explore using pencil shading, paint, water colours and pastel effectively to add colour, depth and detail.

It was a messy, enjoyable, and creative week that resulted in some amazing pieces of finished art where students expressed themselves in these media. Artworks were stored and performances recorded for an exhibition later in the We look forward to vear. having another Arts Week in Term Three.
