The RSA is calling on members to step up and take



# The Rebus Club of Milton

Ruth Gorton from Milton Elder C.A.R.E. was the speaker at the May meeting. She introduced herself and described the organisation. It has been operating for 27 years, governed by a trust of eight members. At the moment there are 29 helpers and 32 clients.

C.A.R.E (or The Club, as members call it) stands for Company/ Activity/ Recreation/ Education. It is funded through the DHB or WINZ for those clients who fit the criteria, with financial help for those who don't. A large group of volunteers help with transport, assistance at the clubrooms and on trips, and with preparing and serving afternoon tea or meals. Loneliness can be an issue for many clients and the social interaction and activities can be so beneficial. Carer respite is also important.

Ruth has recently earned her Diploma at Level 4 to achieve the NZ Certificate of Health and Wellbeing. She prepares a care plan for each client and works in conjunction with doctors, district nurses and mental health providers to ensure the wellbeing of each and every one in her care. Milton is so lucky to have her and her helpers.

Ruth was thanked by Elsie Keast (one of her helpers!) and given a gift of fruit.

The next meeting is on Tuesday 15 June at 10am in the RSA hall. Committee members please meet at 9.30 am. The speaker is Gregg Caldwell who is starting a new venture recycling plastics, tyres and oil.
