As you may know the Clutha District Council has budgeted a total of \$3,365,000 to a new combined swimming pool, library and Council service centre complex.

To make this happen, we as a community would like to fundraise a further \$2,500,000 towards the new pools, common areas and recreational spaces that we hope to have within the building and grounds. A Trust and committee have been formed by local volunteers committed to making this facility a wonderful asset to Milton now and for the future.

The complex will be located at the site of the existing library/service centre on Union Street and at this stage the committee is collating a wish-list from the community as to what could be included in the facility. The committee, Council and design team will then do their very best with the funds available to include as many features as possible. Now is time to put forward your ideas for the facility.

Included in the Genesis this week is a questionnaire to fill out and hand in to the Tokomairiro Community Hub or the Library by 15 August. You can also drop us a message via the Milton Community Pool Facebook page or email miltonpoolcommittee@outlook.com. There is also an opportunity to express any ideas for fundraising on the flier. We would love interested members of the community to actively participate in fundraising activities. The committee have already secured a \$40,000 grant from Lottery Communities toward a Feasibility Study so that our local community is fully aware of all of our opportunities and challenges and technical information ahead of the project. We aim to keep our locals fully informed throughout the process. Please take the opportunity to have your say.

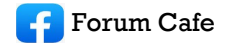
At the conclusion of the meeting the committee produced a post covid-19 celebration luncheon. An enjoyable get together after these unusual past three months with the coronavirus outbreak.

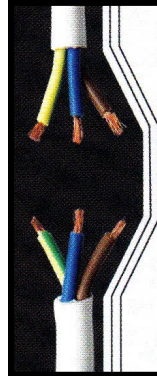

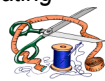
