





It is with pleasure that I submit the twenty fourth annual Chairperson's report for the Milton Community Health Trust (MCHT).

The Milton Community Health Trust usually has eleven meetings in the financial year with an Annual General Meeting held in November. Due to Covid 19 our scheduled April meeting was cancelled. Covid 19 was a stressful time for the MCHT and staff, complicating the delivery of services. Thanks to Staff and Board members that worked through this difficult time to provide a safe, high quality health service to clients within the Milton and Bruce District.

The MCHT is a locally run Health Trust which we believe has a good understanding of the health needs in our community. We provide the following services – District Nursing visits (3,257), Home Help, Occupational Therapy (182), Physiotherapy (1,274), Gym Rehab (34), Meals on Wheels (3374), ACC Wound Care (688). We are also the umbrella organisation for the Tokomairiro Community Hub and a Client Support service.

Funding – The MCHT Board will continue to monitor and work hard at retaining funding to sustain health services to maximise wellness in our community. Dale Wyber, our Nurse Manager and her support team have been very successful again this year in applying for grants to improve our financial position. Thank you to the following organisations that we received monetary donations from – The Rotary Club of Milton, The Otago Community Trust and the Tokomairiro Community Health Trust.

The Hub has continued to grow in demand, with more people popping in to check out what social and health services are available and what local activities are planned. Market Day Tuesday is very popular with free items such as food and clothing to give away. Arna Smith, the Hub Co-ordinator continues to strive to attract more services and organisations to operate within the District. The Hub has had great recognition both in the local community and in wider circles. We encourage people to check out the Hub Facebook page, the milton-district.co.nz website or pop into the Hub to see what is happening.

All the internal Hub renovations have been completed. Thank you to all the volunteers that worked to complete this project.

The Hub received grant funding from COGS, Lottery Community, The Rotary Club of Milton and The Trusts Community Foundation. Without these grants the Hub and the Client Support Service would not operate so we are extremely grateful for their support.

Project Bruce – Kim Schiller - Project Bruce Community Development Manager, assisted by Catherine Paul Project Bruce Sustainability Coordinator have helped to make Project Bruce a success story. Many successful community projects and workshops have been available to Milton, Waihola, and Taieri Mouth residents. Kim and Catherine have office space at the Hub

but spend a lot of their time out and about in the community. Three projects that stand out are the Mens Shed, the Community Garden and Lunches in Schools. These are but a few.

Project Bruce had three-year funding through the Department of Internal Affairs. The three-year funding period was completed in March 2020. Project Bruce, as of April 2020 is no longer under the umbrella of the MCHT and has become an independent Charitable Trust. Thanks Kim, Catherine and all volunteers that have helped our communities become more sustainable through this project, MCHT remains very interested and we wish you well with your future growth.

Project Bruce received grants/donations from COGS, The Rotary Club of Milton, the Clutha District Council, the Milton Choir, Feed Our Kids, The Rotary Club of Balclutha Charitable Trust and a couple of community members. They also received grants after 30th April 2020 which will be reported by their new Charitable Trust in the next financial year.

<u>Donations and Thank yous -</u> We really appreciate the donations from individuals to the MCHT. A lot of donations are an acknowledgement of the care of loved ones through the District Nursing service. All money donated to MCHT remains in our community.

The Board would like to thank the group of dedicated volunteers who deliver Meals on Wheels and also the Volunteer Drivers. Because of Covid 19 some additional volunteers were recruited to deliver these services. Thank you to these people also. Your continued support allows people to remain independently in their own homes.

Volunteers involved at the Hub, within Project Bruce and the committees – this great work wouldn't happen without you.

Thank you, Dale Wyber for your hard work in overseeing the Trust and the Staff who are our most important resource and who have continued to carry the workload over a challenging year.

Thanks also to the rest of the team for their hard work which includes District Nurses, Administration Staff, the Client Support Worker, the Hub Co-ordinator, and the Project Bruce Community Development Team.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the current Board members Justin Geddes, Chris London, Kerry Dowling, Susan Stewart, Gaynor Hayes and Carol Dalton for their continued commitment to the MCHT. We will be sad to farewell Susan Stewart after 12 years, it has been a privilege to work alongside you. Carol Dalton has been a great contributor and attender at meetings as has Gaynor Hayes who has been happy to assist wherever it is needed. Thank you, Carol and Gaynor. I look forward to working with new Board members and I am very pleased to see that we have attracted community interest for these roles.


