Current Moon Phase

The current moon phase is a Waning Gibbous.

The waning gibbous means "humped-back" this is because the brighter part of the moon is shrinking into the shape of a hump-back.

Astrologists believe when you are born in a certain type of moon phase it affects your emotions, you have your high time which is when you have heaps of energy and your low time is when you do not have much energy. If you were born on a waning moon your high time would be when the moon phase is waning and your low time would be the waxing phase of the moon, when your high time phase comes you have a massive appetite and your low time you have a small appetite.

The Waning Gibbous moon symbolises a time of release, gratitude and reflection. This phase means letting go of things and being grateful for what you have, it also means letting go of addiction and habits. That is why the Waning Gibbous is the phase of letting go.

Did you know that the waning gibbous phase only appears on just over 29.5 days out of the year, the same amount of days as a synodic month. After this month's full moon the Waning Gibbous appears from the 26th of February to 2nd of March.

SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.

Tena koutou katoa

As we hit the mid-way point of our first term of 2024 I am very pleased to say that the school year has started extremely well. Students have settled into their learning and the first NCEA assessments for the year are underway. Staff are reporting that there are some really good learning habits developing throughout all year groups. Extra curricular sports are underway and our Prefect Team is doing an amazing job in leading the student body. All in all this year is shaping up to be a fabulous one.

NCEA Level 1

As you are no doubt aware there have been a number of changes to NCEA Level 1 which have come into effect this year. The rationale was to reduce the number of assessments that students sit and make them more meaningful. This means that each subject area will have a maximum of four Achievement Standards (two internal and two external) each worth 5 credits. In addition, the changes were also made to strengthen the literacy and numeracy requirements of NCEA. From 2024 onwards to be awarded NCEA, students will need to achieve 10 credits in Literacy or Te Reo Matatini and 10 credits in Numeracy or Te Pāngarau to show they can use and understand language, as well as mathematics and statistics.

In 2024 and 2025 these credits can be earned in two ways. Firstly through the new Literacy, Te Reo Matatini, Numeracy and Te Pāngarau standards which are referred to as the Common Assessment Activities (CAA). These are a one off exam assessment that students can sit once they are at the required standard. Secondly, students can achieve from a short list of other approved standards mainly in the Mathematics and English curriculum areas.

These credits are known as 'co-requisites' because they are required alongside the other 60 credits needed for NCEA. Without these 10 Literacy and Numeracy credits a student can not attain any NCEA qualifications.

Cellphones

As you already know the Government has introduced regulations that require all state schools to put in place school rules regarding the use of phones. The regulations require that schools must ensure students do not use or access a phone while they are attending school, including during lunch time and breaks. This includes students who are on a school course or visit outside the school grounds.

International research indicates that phones in schools are not conducive for learning and for student wellbeing. Therefore, these regulations have been put in place to ensure that the learning of all students is maximised, while minimising any potential for distraction and cyber-bullying. The Board are currently putting the final parts of the new policy together and this will be going to staff for consultation. Our policy will then be sent out to all caregivers for consultation.

Swimming Sports

There has been a change of date for our Swimming Sports, our next major House Competition event. It is now on March 21st.

The event will be between 1pm and 3pm and will be open for any student who wants to compete. Students who do not want to compete will be in classes as usual. Students were given the opportunity to sign up after assembly last Monday but if they were absent from school they will need to see Mrs Winder to sign up.

St Patrick's Day

On Friday March 15th the Prefect Team will be turning the school green to celebrate St Patrick's day. There will be a green themed mufti which will be a gold coin donation. The money raised from this will be donated to charity. In addition they have some exciting events planned for the day (all with an Irish theme *to be sure*).

Maths Department News...

Mathematics in 2024 is up and flying high. This year we welcome Matt Brown into the Department who is teaching Year 9-10 as well as Year 11 Academic and Financial Literacy. In year 7-8, we also welcome Elijah Smiler who was a student teacher with us last year.

This year our goal is to make mind blowing connections into real world Mathematics. An example of this is Year 9-10 are learning about Fractions and Percentages at the moment - but we are giving real life examples on how these can be applied. Students can also practise these skills when out and about by working how much particular savings are when shopping!

The Year 9-10 students will have the opportunity to take the Common Assessment Activity (known as the CAA) in Term 2 and 3. This is worth 10 credits and is now a compulsory requirement for achieving Level 1. It is a one hour, external examination completed in June and September. These have recently completed our Statistics Unit and found out some interesting results from their own surveys:

- McDonalds and KFC were tied for the most popular fast food takeout.
- The beach (38.7%) was the most popular choice of a place to visit.
- Dogs (72.4%) were more popular than cats (27.6%)
- Samsung was the most popular phone (45%) in front of Iphone (28%), Oppo (18%) and other (9%)
- Students identified the biggest fear in the population was Spiders (26.3%) followed by Clowns (10.5%)
- Favourite colour was Blue (35%) followed by Pink (20%) with both Purple and Red receiving 10% each.
- 73% identified happiness as their main goal over Money (20%) and other (7%)
