
The Mana Pounamu Awards recognise outstanding achievement by Maori students in any of the following areas: Cultural, Sporting, Academic or Community involvement.

Lake Tekapo - AJ Nixon Approaching the stone house on a cold snowy night, I step onto a mix of crunchy snow and gravel in front of a gate. The crunch, crunch, crunch of gravel and snow goes silent as you reach the smooth but slippery footpath of the stone house. Stepping on to the island-like area that the house stands on, everything becomes a bit clearer. It's empty. There's no one here. I ascend the steps to see the stone house in front of me. It's a little bland. I wonder "Is this it, just a stone house?" Looking up behind the house, I see an explosion of colours. The sky brightens up in front of me with blue, purple, white and a shade of red. The stars are scattered everywhere, some bright and some dull. I saw the lake at night. Cold, colourful and alone. But then warm, bright and populated in the day. Lake Tekapo is big and beautiful, day and night, and is the place I can't get out of my head.

The Tokoiti Trek

The students of Tokoiti School, also known as the Trekkers, have been working on a fun and challenging project this term. They have been planning a bike trip around the South Island for their principal, Shannon, who loves to ride his bike very far and safely. They have called it the Tokoiti Trek.

Each time they completed one round, they got a stick from their teacher. The sticks were like kilometers for Shannon. They added up all the sticks and it was 1666 kilometers. That's a huge distance!

The students were inspired by some amazing bike riders they learned about, such as Chris and Stella who rode on the Iron Butt Rally and Mark who rode across the USA on dirt roads. They wanted to challenge Shannon to do something similar in New Zealand.

This term, they helped Shannon plan his bike trip. They used their computers to find some interesting places for him to see on his way. They also learned about the geography and history of the South Island. They chose some places that were important or beautiful or funny. For example, Jamez chose Jimmy's Pies because they are the best pies in the world. One Trekker chose Big Nuts NZ because their grandfather owns it and they make different kinds of nuts. Another student chose the Dunedin Ice Skating Rink because that was a special place for his whānau.

They made a map for Shannon to follow and marked all the places they chose. They also made some pictures for Shannon to take with him on his bike. Shannon is going on his bike trip on Tuesday 31st and the students are very excited to see his photos. He said he would take a photo at each place he visits and show them he was there. He is doing it by himself, but he has a phone and a GPS to keep him safe. He has to finish in one day.

The students are very proud of him and they hope he has a great time. They think he is a brave, adventurous and annoying principal who likes to try new things. They are looking forward to seeing his photos and hearing his stories when he comes back.

Waihola Swans Triumph Over Milton King Crabs The Waihola Swans have taken bragging rights in their open-ing Clutha Vets South Otago Cricket T20 encounter over ing Clutha Vets South Otago the Milton King Crabs, played on a fine Sunday in Milton. Milton batted first and lost opener Dylan Greer on the first ball of the innings off the bowling of Jared Hayes. Things didn't improve much in the early stages for the King Crabs as they soon lost two more wickets to be struggling at 22 for the loss of three. The Powerful Jacob Jenkins managed to accumulate some runs for his side before being dismissed by Ryan Clark for 15 runs. This was Clark's third wicket inside three overs. The Milton middle order added some substance largely thanks to skipper Ben Cameron (25) and Corey Bradley (10). Some extremely tight bowling towards the end of the innings by Swans bowlers Shelford Meads and Jared Cunningham restricted the late flow of runs and Milton limped to 72 for the loss of nine wickets form their 20 overs. Cameron was the pick of the batters, opting to run quick singles early before unleashing with a couple of sixes towards the end of his innings. Jenkins and Bradley both looked in good touch at times too. Ryan Clark was the pick of the Waihola bowlers with tasty figures of three for nine off three overs. In reply Waihola didn't have it all their own way, losing opener Toby Greene in the first over and first drop Levin Coulter-Butler at the start of the second. This gave Milton confidence, and they bowled in some decent areas at the start of the innings. Waihola opener Ryan Clark built on his fantastic first innings by carrying his bat through the innings for an unbeaten 38. Clark was ably assisted by Rowan Craw who looked as composed as ever on his way to an unbeaten 22 as Waihola chased the total down with seven overs to spare. Milton opener Corey Bradley was dangerous with the cherry and took away steady figures of one for nine off three overs. Daniel Samson was the other Milton bowler to take a pole in the match as Waihola gain hold of the Burt Pringle Trophy and the Bungard Cleats for the inaugural time.
