Snails Visit TELC

Our tamariki have always been very interested in bugs and insects, and to foster this, we converted our old fish tank into a snail house. This gave them the opportunity to observe the snails as they slithered about and made their way up the side of the glass towards the lid. The tamariki were fascinated by how the snails poked their heads out of their shell, then immediately retracted them as soon as they were touched. They also used the magnifying glass to view them up close and some even went as far as holding them in their hands. This experience was also used to enhance their oral language skills as they discussed the different body parts and talked about the silky trails the snails left behind, as they slowly glided across the plants. On Thursday this week our four year olds are heading off on our annual Beach and Bug trip to Kaka Point Beach and Earthlore, an insect park near Owaka, where they will have even more opportunities to

experience the wonders of the natural world and check out some new insect varieties, as well as having a fun paddle in the sea.







A Place to Rest in Milton

Stan and Bronwyn Leishman purchased Doug Nesbit Funerals in August 2020. They kept on the full team of staff and have continued to provide high level of service to the South Otago Community. At the time of purchase, Doug Nesbit closed the Milton Lounge (beside the Forum Café). The lounge had been occasionally used for resting Milton people and provided a place to rest the deceased and for Milton families to view.

Since then Stan and Bronwyn have received feedback from the locals about the need for a place that families can go and view their loved ones and spend time with them.

Stan and Bronwyn brought the Anglican Vicarage off St John's Anglican Church and have been restoring it to something of its former glory. Stan has a good relationship with the Anglican Church ladies and has kept an eye on the church and helped with maintenance. In November 2020 Stan approached the St John's Anglican Church and asked them if they would consider allowing their church to be used as a place to rest the deceased and families can come to view and grieve. They were delighted with the concept. This was put to the Anglican Diocese in Dunedin. They signed off on the arrangement.

Since then, four Milton locals have been rested at the church and families have come to view. It has proven to be great success. Stan would like to personally thank Pauline Bacon for her support and enthusiasm of the concept and making it happen.
