


Tokomairiro High School Newsletter...

SCHOOL MISSION: Inspiring Excellence in Education, in Character and in Life.

Kia ora,

A more challenging message this week after the highs of the Mountbatten presentation last Monday. With increasing strain on families due to the many economic and social condition we are experiencing at the moment I thought it would be worthwhile discussing the poverty or low-income cycle. A diagram is show below and through circumstances outside their control some of our families already live in this cycle and some are moving towards it. As we can see in the diagram below a whole series of actions are likely to come about for these families resulting in the process being repeated onto the next generation.



Our school mission statement is “Working together to inspire excellence in education character and life.” We therefore feel obligated to ensure that our students and families experience excellent lives as a result of their time with us. According to World Vision “One of the biggest contributors to ending poverty is ensuring children have an education. For any child, education can open doors to the future that would otherwise be locked tight. Children who are not in school are at greater risk of exploitation and early marriage. They’re on track for a much lower income once they grow up. This limits the future for their own children, thus repeating the cycle of poverty generation after generation.”

We are therefore working hard to ensure all student attend school regularly to help some break free of this trap, some avoiding the trap and the lucky few ensuring that they continue to exceed in school and life and avoid the trap all together.

Attendance matters and every day is important we are working hard to ensure students develop the academic knowledge and practical skills they need to be better prepared for better employment or further study. We therefore need your help to ensure all students attend school regularly so that we can maintain the constant flow of knowledge they require to be successful and break the cycle. We look forward to working together to achieve this.

Tokomairiro High School Term 3 Focus

- ◆ In term 2 almost ½ of all Classroom KAMAR Entries (the system staff use to record problem behaviours) were actually in the category "Amazing Work".
- ◆ In term 2 class teachers gave Year 7 students 77 house points for outstanding classroom behaviour; Year 8s got 167; 9s and 10s got 121 each; 11, 12, 13 earned 17 each.
- ◆ In term 2 staff identified "Social Concern" - problems with how some students were relating with one another - as an area that needs work in term 3. So we will be actively teaching and rewarding the following linked behaviours in the next 7 weeks:

Respect / Whakaute: We work hard to develop positive relationships with others

Responsibility / Haepapa: We encourage others to act responsibly

Excellence / Hiranga: We conduct ourselves in ways that make us, our whanau, school and community proud

Discussions around these concepts, what they look and sound like, and how we can make them real in our day to day interactions will be happening in our classrooms, and where possible, we encourage them to happen at home as well. He rau ringa e oti ai - Many hands make light work! We look forward to celebrating even more success in the coming weeks!
