From the six entries, four received multiple awards to commemorate the outstanding effort for the science investigations that they presented.

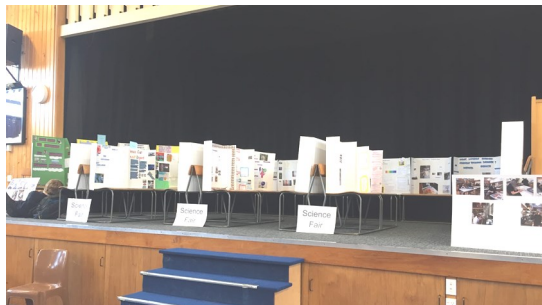

Girls Visit Women In IT

At the end of the term a group of eight girls visited the Otago Museum and company Animated Research Ltd in Dunedin. Our goal was to promote roles and possibilities for women in the IT industry because there is traditionally a large disproportion between males and females in this sector.

The museum hosted an exhibition presenting video games exclusively created by female developers and the girls had a chance to play the games and learn about the personal stories of the authors.

In the afternoon we visited a successful multimedia company which focuses on 3D design and developing tools to provide infographics for live sport events such as golf, cricket or Formula 1. Cheryl Adams shared her career path from a sheep farm in Canterbury, to engineering study at university, up to the current position as a project manager and CEO.

The girls enjoyed the trip and learned about the variety of opportunities open to women interested in digital technology and beyond.



Taieri Beach School Report

Our core values at Taieri Beach School are Whakaute (Respect) and Kawenga (Responsibility) for ourselves, others and especially for Papatūānuku (Mother Earth).

We have an organic vegetable garden and orchard, have designed and constructed a bird feeder for our visiting native birds and we even take care of our Pine Cone Whanau, making sure they keep warm in our fairy house during our frosty nights.

We have taken advantage of the warmer weather to add another seasonal feature to the outside area we call Paradise. Using natural materials we found in the school grounds, we constructed a large mandala taking care to keep the geometric design consistent.

Stage 2 of our development plan for the Bug City involved the creation of Spring Hotel (made out of old trampoline springs), a fire pit (using an old scrubbing brush and a red plastic container lid), a spa pool (constructed from a blue plastic lid) and a giant swing using recycled materials found at school. Bertie the Bumble Bee has trialled the health and safety of the swing and it's all go for the Grand Opening.



The children have taken on the responsibility of decorating the school's front fence using a sea theme. It took many weeks of work with lots of patience and care to create the Picasso style fish paintings but it was so worth it.

We love the vibrant colours the children chose and the paintings are enjoyed by many of the community as they pass by. Tino pai te mahi e hoa (Awesome, well done!)

The Rebus Club of Milton

At the September meeting, Alastair Yule, formerly a surgeon at Balclutha hospital and Dunedin hospital, spoke of his work with Mercy Ships. This is an organisation that uses hospital ships filled with volunteer professionals to provide free healthcare and surgery to areas of the world where it is not available. It is a global Christian organisation. Volunteers from over 50 nations pay their own way to serve in the team, protected by Gurkha soldiers when in ports. Many varied operations are undertaken with life changing results.

A country is first approached for its needs. (This also includes agricultural training and development, well drilling, safe water etc.) Patients are then screened to see who can be helped by doctors. The government will pay for them to get to the ship and the surgery is free. So far 2.56 million people have been helped. Other work carried out includes dental, orthopaedic and plastic surgery.

Alastair retired in 2013 but is still involved with the NZ committee. He was thanked by Malcolm McElrea and given a gift of fruit.

The next meeting is on Tuesday October 18 at 10 am in the RSA hall. Committee please be there at 9.30 am. After morning tea and a brief meeting, there will be a visit to The Men's Shed. Transport will be arranged from the RSA hall.
