Alongside our regular activities such as maintaining McNally Track, supporting the Tramping Club and Youth Adventure Trust, we have continued to contribute funds to a full range of activities within our community



Treasurer Suzie Bearman reported that just over \$40,000 was donated to our local community over the past year and a further \$6750 to overseas projects. The local projects included the Fire Brigade, Toko Community Recreation Centre, Community Garden, Tertiary Study Bursary, Tokomairi High School Greenhouse, Milton Kindergarten, Outward Bound students, Blessed Box, Milton Health Community Trust, Milton Elder C.A.R.E, THS Senior Touch Team, Webcam Taieri Mouth, Pink Ribbon Event, Waiholo School (Aqua Bots Kits), THS Music Lessons. We have also supported several families in a time of crisis. Many members of our community were supported through this wide range of donations.

The club also potted up several hundred native trees for use on the cycle way and water ways in our community, ran a collection for child cancer, supported an inaugural Pink Ribbon event and after lots of discussion, have commitment from our club and the Clutha District Council for a memorial walking track for long-time member and Waiholo resident, Peter Vollweiler.

A huge thanks goes to Stephen for leading our club for that past year and we wish Colin all the best for his year at the helm.

Banking Services Coordinator

The Clutha Budget Advisory Service is excited to announce that we have secured funding from the New Zealand Banker's Association, with FinCap, for a 12 month contract to deliver a banking services initiative.

Over the last year Balclutha has seen the closure of two banks, and the opening hours reduced for the remaining two. Cheques have become a thing of the past and banking customers are now expected to be able to do their banking digitally. We are aware that this has created issues for some vulnerable people in our community who are unable to use online banking so are now left in limbo as to how to pay bills and keep track of their money.

The funding we have received has enabled us to employ a Banking Services Coordinator, Amy Senada, to support those people who need some help to navigate the new ways of banking. Amy is available to work one-on-one, and to do talks with community groups. We envisage that Amy will be able to work with clients to set up and use internet banking (if that is an option for them) – and give them ongoing support, to set up and use phone banking, set up bill payments, get in contact with their bank to discuss their needs, talk to creditors to arrange setting up of direct debits, provide information on how to avoid scams, support them to safely set up and store passwords, help with accessing MyIR and MyMSD.... whatever support is needed, Amy will provide this on an ongoing basis with the aim of working out a plan for the individual and their needs.

Amy will be mobile and available in Milton and Balclutha one day a month. She will be able to make home visits as well. Please feel free to contact Amy with any referrals.
