NCEA Exams We are now in the second week of NCEA exams. It is really pleasing to see a number of senior students coming into school to ask for extra help and using the time to prepare for the exams thoroughly. So far the feedback from the students and the staff has been that the exams have been fair and students have felt quite confident about their performance. You may also have seen in the press that there were some technical problems seen around the country with the NCEA English Level One digital exam last Friday; I am relieved to report that in the main our students were not affected by these difficulties.


A move south of Milton and buying into the family honey business has given them new challenges and with Dad's

These cover all wars right through from the New Zealand Land Wars and the Boer War, to the First and Second World Wars and the later Korea and Vietnam conflicts. New Zealand Servicemen and Women first served overseas in the Boer War in South Africa around 1900 and the war medals awarded for this service are needed by the buyers, as are any other Medals from early New Zealand and the New Zealand Wars.

General service medals from both the First and General service medals from both the First and Second World Wars will also be purchased, but as can be imagined these were awarded in fairly large numbers.
