Be an Upstander

In a bullying situation, an Upstander is someone who recognises when something is wrong and does something to make it right. If an Upstander sees or hears about bullying, he or she will do something about it. This could mean stopping the bully, reporting the event, or otherwise helping the victim even after the fact.

On the other hand, a *bystander* is someone who sees bullying happening and does nothing to stop it. People who laugh at something mean a bully says, or don't say anything when they see bullying happening, are bystanders. By doing nothing, the bystander is negatively contributing to the bullying situation.

We understand that there are many reasons someone may not be an Upstander, they are often afraid of retaliation or that their own group of friends will exclude them. However, with our Upstander initiative we can help these people make a confidential report if they see something that isn't right in our school community. These reports are only seen by the Guidance Counsellor, and he will meet with you prior to taking any action, in most situations people will not know that you have spoken up if this is what you prefer.

While school wifi has been turned off for students' phones, the form is still accessible from home via their phones and on Google Drive at school with their Chromebooks. So, please encourage your young person to be an Upstander against bullying in our community and become part of the solution.

Project Bruce has been extremely lucky to be able to establish a garden for the benefit of the community at the back of the showgrounds. The garden space has very generously been supplied to us by the South Otago Heritage Society, who lease the land. Originally, local John man Goldsworthy worked the patch to provide potatoes and veges to the community, so when he passed away in 2019 the Heritage Society asked if we would like to continue

It's been a busy few months here at Spenser Street and our tamariki have been making the most of the opportunity to get outside and explore their environment. We have been very fortunate to receive a \$1900 grant from the Mazda Foundation, which has allowed us to purchase an outdoor jumping mat to develop risk taking and physical skills in our tamariki. We also used these funds to purchase construction type resources and child sized carpentry tools, which assist in the development of their fine motor skills.

The outdoor environment will be upgraded in the coming months, following the receipt of a \$2000 grant from the Lions Club of Milton. These funds will be put towards the cost of building a small retaining wall, installing a water feature and planting native shrubs to enhance the visual appeal of the area. Last week we also received notification that we have been granted \$1500 from the Otago Masonic Charitable Trust to purchase new play equipment for our tamariki including construction sets and items for the family play area. We are extremely grateful to all three organisations for their generosity and allowing us continue to make improvements to our outdoor area and purchase new resources to enhance the types of experiences we can offer our tamariki.

Last week we participated in Pink Shirt Day, with the teachers and our tamariki dressing up in pink to raise awareness of preventing bullying and celebrating diversity through promoting kindness and inclusiveness. This is an area that we actively promote to our children and it is reflected in our centre philosophy and values.

We have recently had Rebecca Walker join us and the kaiako, tamariki and their whanau are very pleased to have her become part of our centre community. We have also had Tylah Whakatihi and Sadie Hall graduate this month and head off to school. We wish them both all the best for the next exciting stage of their learning journey.
