The Milton Senior Citizens Group has been running for approximately 50 years. Over the years, numbers were capped at 100 members, and there was a waiting list for those aged over 55 to join. The group first started in the St John's Church Hall, and the RSA offered them land—where it now stands—for a small sum of money.

As like other groups in our community, members have dwindled and it was not viable for the 12-15 members to carry on so we held meetings with the RSA, and offered the building back to

them, which they have now taken on.

As we were an Incorporated Society the monies we had left were to go to a Charitable Organisation in the town. We decided that the Milton Volunteer Fire Brigade did a lot for the community as First Responders so they were the lucky

recipients. They will put the money into their rescue fund, and will hopefully have enough to buy a Stokes basket for rescues in steep terrain.

Student's Passion Leads to Great Opportunity

Tokomairiro High School Year 13 student Lucious Mann shares his experience of attending a programme based on his passion for astronomy.

This year, I was accepted into the SWAPA, Students With A Passion for Astronomy programme. It's an annual scholarship programme that is run by the Royal Astronomical Society of New Zealand for students in years 11-13, that allows the students to attend the meeting, and covers the costs for entry and for transport as well. I was able to fly up to Whangarei over the Queen's Birthday weekend to attend the conference, along with fifteen other students. There, I was able to meet a number of the leading doctors and professors in the field of astronomy, as well as a number of amateur astronomers. We were treated to the life story of Glen Rowe, an amateur astronomer who has had astronomy be a part of his whole life, as well as an international call from none other than Doctor John Mather, the head of the team in charge of the recently launched James Webb Space Telescope - the most powerful telescope humanity has ever had, with a mirror over twice as large as the old Hubble Space Telescope.

We were also treated to ongoing research from students around the country, and we also learned the threat to astronomy that satellite constellations such as Starlink pose, with satellites streaking across the sky, ruining photos and attempted observations, and also on the dangers of space junk and Kessler Syndrome, which is the _____

process of space junk colliding and creating so many fragments that it becomes too dangerous to send anything to orbit.

Not only did I attend presentations over the three days, but I was able to talk to other students my age with an interest in astronomy, many of whom had taken part in photographing distant planets and stars - astrophotography. I was able to meet professors and students I will be seeing again very soon, next year in fact, as I enter the university to study the subject further.

I am incredibly grateful for the school and RASNZ for providing the opportunity to attend and meet the people I'll be around and working with in future, as well as having the opportunity to learn about things on the cutting edge of the scientific community.


