After much deliberation I have made the decision to retire as Principal of Tokomairi High School.

During term two I had the opportunity to spend two months based in Australia with my daughter and granddaughters (now aged two and a half and 7 months) and I realized how much I wanted to be able to spend more time with family (Covid permitting), both in New Zealand and in Australia.

When I was interviewed for the Principal's position here at Tokomairi, I was asked how long I expected to stay. I replied that I didn't know but at least seven years. At the end of 2020 I completed that seven years and had seen one cohort of students through from Year 7 to Year 13.

This is now my eighth year as Principal and I have decided it is time for someone else to take the reins and to lead this school into the future. I have handed in my resignation and will be finishing at the end of 2021. I will have then completed forty-three years of teaching.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time at Tokomairi High School and am proud of many of the things we achieve as a school. We have a great staff and great kids. I encourage all our young people to make the most of every opportunity that comes their way, to engage in their learning, and to take advantage of the support available to them in this small semi-rural school. Most of all, never under-estimate what you are capable of.

We have great teachers across all our schools in Milton and it has been a privilege to work with them through the Kahui Ako over the past four years. I will continue to follow the accomplishments of Milton young people well into the future.

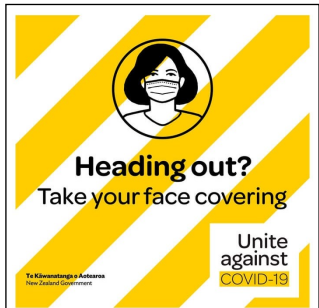

Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori – 13 – 19 September. This is Māori Language Week. There will be activities run by students from Whaea Clare's Māori classes. Hopefully, on Tuesday at 12pm, many of our teachers and students will have taken part in the Māori Language Moment – setting a world record for people speaking and celebrating an endangered, Indigenous language at the same time.

Week Eight of Term Three It was great to have staff and most of our students back in school on Thursday and Friday last week. These last three weeks of term are an opportunity for all our students to get back into the routine of school – good sleep patterns, concentration in class, engaging in learning. Remember, your teachers are always there to support you.

For those students not yet able to return to school, it is important you keep in touch with your teachers and keep up to date. Your lessons will be provided through your Google Classrooms.

Family Learning Conferences These were scheduled for Wednesday 15 September, however they have now been postponed one week, until Wednesday 22 September.

These will be for Year 10 to Year 12 students and their whanau. As the term moves on, we need to be planning for next year and these students need to meet with mentor teachers to discuss their option choices for 2022. There will also be information about NCEA, especially for year 10 students and parents.

House Group Changes Last week you will have received an email about the changes we are making to our House Groups. Starting this week, we have changed the groupings of our House Groups and teachers, with groups now being Year 7-8, Year 9-10 and Year 11-13. This will allow us to focus on the particular needs of the students at different year levels.

Wellbeing The wellbeing of our young people is paramount at

this time. If you have any concerns about the wellbeing of any of our young people, please contact us. Ross MacKinnon, our Guidance Counsellor is available to meet with young people, either online or by phone, and he will help them if they need further support. ross@tokohigh.school.nz

NCEA Examinations The Ministry of Education has made the decision to move the NCEA Examination period two weeks later. It will now go from 22 November to 14 December. As well as that, the dates for the arts portfolios have also been delayed by two weeks.

Junior Curriculum Review Over the past few weeks our planning for making changes to the Year 9/10 curriculum has gained momentum. Our current model of five core classes and two option lines has been the status quo for decades. As a school we feel that this model no longer inspires or engages our learners to be the best they can be or prepares them fully for the future of changing workplaces. Our vision is that we have a curriculum that allows each and every student to have a unique learning experience that reflects their unique personality, learning style and aspirations. We are currently working on some of the finer details of how we can offer a more individualised curriculum for our students and are planning to have a new look Year 9/10 curriculum in place at the start of 2022. There will be an information evening in Term Four for caregivers to understand the changes we are making and to ask any questions.

Policy Review Thank you to the small number of parents who have given some feedback on the policies under review this term. We are keen to hear from more; we need your opinion and ideas to help us be the best school we can be. As part of our self-review plan our Concerns and Complaints, and Behaviour Management policies are now needing to be reviewed. We are asking parents to review these policies by visiting the SchoolDocs website - <https://tokohigh.schoolsdocs.co.nz/1893.htm>. The login is *tokohigh* and the password is *genesis*. Once you are logged onto the website follow the link to the policy and once you have read it click the 'Review Policy' button on the top right-hand corner of the page. You can then leave ratings and any comments you wish to make.

Building Projects

Access to different areas of the school is being hampered at present as the project for improving the grounds and making the surfaces less of a trip hazard continues. All the concrete at the west end of C Block and the back of the Science block is being replaced. Unfortunately, our contractors have come across some issues with old water pipes collapsing and electrical cabling being exposed. They are working closely with the Ministry of Education to make sure this is all fixed and site plans are updated.

Although the access issues are an inconvenience to many, we know it will all be worth it in the end when we have lovely smooth surfaces around the school. The east end of C Block is certainly a huge improvement to what it was.

The ramp into the whare is also under construction, although has been on hold over the lockdown. This will be completed during the next term break.



Toko Gym Report

Welcome back to the gym. We are open again with 24 hour access during Level 2. We look forward to seeing everyone back again.

There are guidelines to follow as we get through Level 2 and appreciate everyone's co-operation.

Things to be aware of:

- * Stay home if unwell
- * Masks to be worn in the entrance foyer area upon arrival and departure but do not have to be worn during exercise.
- * Scan the QR Code or be manually signed in (Covid contact tracing).
- * Fob holders scan on arrival and departure (Health and Safety).
- * Hand sanitiser is provided.
- * Bring a sweat towel. This is a MUST.
- * Keep to the 2 metres distance from others rule.
- * Wipe down equipment with disinfectant provided. (before and after use)
- * Bring your own filled water bottle. Our water dispenser is disabled during Level 2.
- * Members must shower at home during Level 2.

Probus Club of Milton

After due consideration, the committee has agreed that there will be no September meeting. With the protocol required and unknown time of return to Level 1 it was the best option. We look forward to the next meeting in October.

Last month the speaker was Aaron Whitley who introduced himself as a boy growing up in Milton and attending school here. He now works at HeliOtago, mostly as an agricultural pilot but also as chief instructor, examiner and relief rescue pilot. He left school to join the air force and train as a mechanical engineer as at that time his eyesight precluded him from flying. He started with three months of intensive training and when qualified worked on Skyhawks with 75 Squadron in Ohakea. After three years he relocated to Australia to join Number 2 Squadron working with the Australian Navy. Exercises included simulating air attacks for the navy vessels to deal with.

He always wanted to travel so after leaving the air force he spent months in Egypt and Europe and later in Africa. He was based in the UK working on Boeing aircraft before changing to helicopters then trains.

The desire to fly never left so when he returned to NZ he trained as a helicopter pilot in Blenheim before moving with his family to Mosgiel. HeliOtago supports the biggest air ambulance service in NZ covering rescue, accidents, serious medical events and inter hospital transfers. Other work undertaken is agricultural spraying, fire fighting, reconnaissance after floods and dropping off farmers and dogs to snow rake and make tracks for stock during heavy snow storms. Aaron was thanked by Philip Lindsay and given a gift of fruit.
