On-Task Behaviour

Since we started our Focus on Learning earlier this month, teachers have awarded 128 house points for Respect, Responsibility and Excellence. The names of students who have earned points were put into

a draw, and the winner of a Subway Voucher and Tokomairiro High School pen at Monday's assembly was: James Walker. Fa'amālō atu, James!!

A suitable whakatauki to guide our thinking around on-task behaviour is "He waka eke noa: We are all in this together". Notions that come to mind when we think about he waka eke noa are things like inclusivity and the fact that even though all of us are different, when we accept and understand one another, we all get better. And that's pretty powerful.

In the last couple of weeks students and teachers have been discussing how to show respect for one another by allowing others to learn, showing responsibility by focusing on our learning tasks, and demonstrating excellence by putting our best effort into every lesson. A lot of the ideas that have come out of these discussions capture he waka eke noa really well

Students have told us that respect looks like:

Whakaute, Helping others, taking turns, checking in on your mate, picking up after ourselves and others, accepting people and not judging them, making sure everyone is included in their learning and in ours as well, always listening to other people's feelings, not judging people, respecting other's ideas, being nice to everyone, listening and not ignoring anyone, acknowledging that others are only trying to learn, respecting that all opinions can bring new light to a subject and that everyone thinks in different ways, explaining when someone doesn't understand, considering another's wellbeing, teamwork makes the dream work, treating people the way you wan to be treated, be thankful, showing kindness towards others, caring for others, making sure that everyone matters.

Our challenge, today and always, is to acknowledge our differences, learn about what makes us great, and work really hard to include one another in whatever we're doing!

RESPECT - we allow others to learn.

RESPONSIBILITY - we focus on the learning task we are given EXCELLENCE - we put our best effort into every lesson.

Samoan Language Week - The theme for Vaiaso o le Gagana Samoa - Samoa Language Week 2023 is 'Mitamita i lau gagana, maua'a lou fa'asinomaga' which means 'Be proud of your language and grounded in your identity'. We will be celebrating the Samoan language at school this week. During the week there will be activities for students to encourage them to learn and use a few words of Samoan.

Farewell to Megan—Megan O'Donnell joined us last year as a Teacher Aide and sadly we have to say haere ra to her this week as she is starting a new position. Megan's dedication and care for our students over the past few months has been immense and we are very grateful for her time with us. We wish Megan all the best for the future.

Basketball Competition—For the remainder of this term we are going to be hosting an inter house basketball competition. This basketball competition is going to last four weeks and we are hoping to have an amazing time with it. Students from all ages are welcomed to participate as this will be such a fun event to end the term off with. There will be a prize of house

points to be given out to the winners so we can't wait to see who shows up.

Semester change over and reports—The end of the first Y11-13 semester for our students is only a couple of weeks away. This means that most of our senior students will assessment deadlines over the next few days. It is important that students vitally take these deadlines seriously and submit work that they are proud of. At the end of the term

It's hard to believe that we are halfway through the second Semester report sent out which will outline how many credits students have attained in each of their semester one courses. Year 9 and 10 students will also be changing semesters at the end of the term. Over the next few days students will have the option to review their subject choices for semester two.

Maths Common Assessment Activity—June the 13th is the date for the first Maths Common Assessment Activity for selected Year 10 students. These students have the opportunity to sit NCEA Standard 32406: Use mathematics and statistics to meet numeracy demands in a range of situations. This is an external examination, completed digitally. We wish these students all the best and encourage them to put the effort into their preparation!

Attendance Reporting-As we head into winter we are seeing a number of our students coming down with colds and other winter ailments. If your child is off sick please let either the office of their house group teacher know so we can amend their attendance accordingly.

Update of Industrial Action—As you are aware the current industrial action has been suspended while negotiations take place between the Ministry of Education and the teaching Unions. The suspension of industrial action is due to end on 30th June when the decision will be made to continue with the action or cancel it. We will let caregivers know what the outcome is as soon as we are able to.

Policy Review-As part of our self review plan the Board of Trustees is reviewing our policies regarding Education outside of the classroom. Given the recent tragedy in Northland this is a timely and very important piece of work.
