

Waihola - Clarendon Womens Institute

The Waihola-Clarendon WI held its monthly meeting under COVID-19 Level 2 constraints in the Wailhola Bowling Club rooms. Members enjoyed two fascinating speakers after a quick business meeting. It is the organisation's Medical Research Month, and the topic chosen to reflect this -'breast cancer'. Our speakers were both oncology trained registered nurses who now work for the Otago Cancer Society, providing supportive care for patients at all stages of their journey with breast cancer. Members were told that this is unusual as most agencies specialise in just one stage. They both emphasised the importance of screening programmes and the result this has in detecting disease early, with better outcomes. We were encouraged to persist until happy with the results from a GP consultation, and given examples of determined women who had done this. Risk factors were described, but the range of ages (under 30 to over 90) and both women and men being diagnosed were not what we expected. To be alert for any change, undertake regular physical activity and maintain a healthy weight was their advice. The diagnosis process was described in detail and the multidisciplinary approach to treatment explained, including the range of procedures that might be offered. Again, the support offered; including transport to and from appointments, the availability of prostheses and the 'Look Good, Feel Good' programme left us all feeling very reassured as did a final reminder that an 'incurable' diagnosis does not mean a very short life is left. Jennie thanked them on our behalf. There were many questions still being answered during the shared lunch which followed.


