
### Year 11 Geography Research Project

#### Uniform

### Online Lessons

#### **Building Capabilities**

Building Capabilities is an area we are keen to foster within our school. Capabilities come in all shapes and sizes and include such things as creativity, communication skills,

organisation, resilience and self-management. Being able to build resilience is important for our young people. Having the skills to build resilience can minimise the effects of negative, stressful situations. These skills allow a young person to face challenges, learn from them, and develop ways to live a healthy and happy life. Many of our young people, and I'm sure many parents too, have shown high levels of resilience during lockdown. One aspect of building resilience is

developing Impulse Control - an essential resilience skill.



Being resilient doesn't mean that we don't feel impulsive; rather, it means that we learn to control our impulses. The strategy suggested for developing Impulse Control is 'THINK-IMPULSE STRATEGY' 1.Stop. Think. (Delay your response.)

3. Three responses - to choose from. (Don't say anything until you have thought of three responses.)

Senior students have received a list of the modules available for Semester Two, along with the choices they made late last year or earlier this year. We know some students will have changed their



### New Chairperson for Otago Community Trust

Otago Community Trust has announced the appointment of John Wilson as its new chair. John takes over the Trust's chair role from Ross McRobie effective from 1 June 2020. Ross will remain on the board of Otago Community Trust as a trustee until such time that the Minister of Finance makes the new trustee appointments.

The Otago Community Trust is a philanthropic organisation which applies its Trust funds for charitable and other

purposes which are of benefit to the community. The Otago Community Trust has its origins in the Dunedin Savings Bank, established in 1864 by public spirited citizens seeking to encourage thrift within the community, and distribute surplus profits to charitable causes.

In the mid 1990's the Otago Community Trust as it is now known sold its shares in Trust Bank New Zealand Ltd for \$131M and invested the proceeds.

The Trust now has over \$280M invested and since its inception has granted more than \$180M into the Otago Region. The Trust aims to make wise investment decisions that preserve the original capital for future generations as well as having a healthy grant budget each year. **Covid-19 Response Fund** 

# The Trust continues to approve much needed COVID-19 funding. To date \$514,778.36 has been awarded to 41

community organisations since the dedicated COVID-19 Response Fund was opened in early April. This included \$25,000 for the Clutha District Council.
