However, children and young people have begun to come in to our grounds again and have been breaking bottles, damaging the playground, writing graffiti and littering our school.

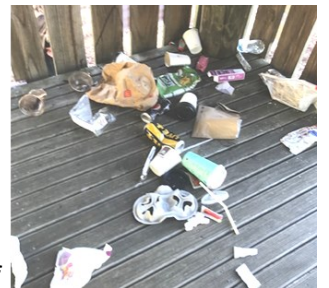
ST MARY'S SCHOOL IS CLOSED TO THE WIDER COMMUNITY!

Year 7 and 8 Tokomairiro World Expo

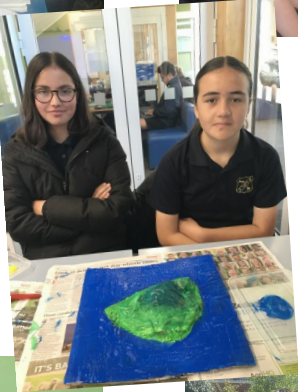

Waihola Swans Cricket Team
