Congratulations to you all for this great effort.



New Learning Support Role

Carmel Marshall discusses her role as Learning Support Coordinator for our local schools.

The role of the Learning Support Coordinator (LSC) in New Zealand schools is an exciting new one. There are just over 600 of us currently employed by the Ministry of Education (around 50 in Otago/Southland) and we work within "clusters" of schools.

This is the first year for Learning Support Coordinators (LSCs), and we are still learning about all the ways we can support schools. I am the sole LSC



working in the Tokomairiro Kahui Ako (Community of Learning), and I work across five schools) in the Milton and Lawrence districts - Tokomairiro High School, Milton Primary School (where I will be based), St Mary's School Milton, Waitahuna School and Lawrence Area School. My background is as a primary school teacher and former deputy principal. I have taught at all primary and

intermediate levels, and have worked in both rural and urban schools across NZ. I have also worked as a health educator in schools, and

lectured in teacher education at the University of Auckland. The Ministry of Education has a growing focus on ensuring schools meet the needs of diverse learners. Part of my role is to help schools identify those who need additional support or extension in the classroom, and to work out what support they would benefit from. I help apply for funding and resources for individuals and groups of learners. The role is also about simplifying the current learning support system to make it easier for parents and schools.

LSCs work collaboratively to organise learning support around what best meets the needs of children and young people across the local community. In order to do this, we work with several agencies and professionals to bring about the best outcomes, including: Resource Teachers of

Learning and Behaviour (RTLBs), Resource Teachers of Literacy (RTLit), Public Health Nurses (PHN), SENCos (Special Educational Needs Coordinators), Ministry of Education specialists and others.

One of my key projects has been to establish a Learning Support Register in each of the schools. This helps the schools to keep track of the learning needs and the support that children and young people are receiving, thereby ensuring that resources are focused in the right places. We are also able to use the Register to look at trends across individual schools, and across all five schools, so that the teachers can learn together where there are common needs. I am really enjoying the variety of this new role, and building relationships with so many fantastic people across the community. I am lucky to be able to work with such a great bunch of people - teachers, teacher aides, principals/school leadership teams, families/whanau, students and agencies. I look forward to developing this role further. Carmel Marshall

Year 12 Geography Camp - Quarantine Island

This year, the Year 12 Geography class decided to do their research standard looking at lockdowns of the past on Quarantine Island, in Otago Harbour.

On Wednesday the 2nd September, we visited Toitu to find out about the early settlement of Dunedin, then to the University to find out how Dunedin was planned. Next we drove to Port Chalmers to board the *Vivienne J* to the Island. We were met by Meghan Hughes the new Keeper of the Island. She told us about the history of the Island as a Quarantine Station for the ships coming to Dunedin with Immigrants from 1860 to 1920. The Passengers of the ships that had disease on board had to stay for a period of two weeks, to ensure they did not infect the population of Dunedin with smallpox, scarlet fever, measles or typhoid. There were boarding houses on the Island and two hospitals. The Cemetery provided the information for our research on patterns as we looked at factors like gender, age, country of origin, cause of death.

On Thursday the *Vivienne J* was back to get us and took us on a cruise around the harbour.

Two amazing days, great weather, great group of people. Sue Nelson
